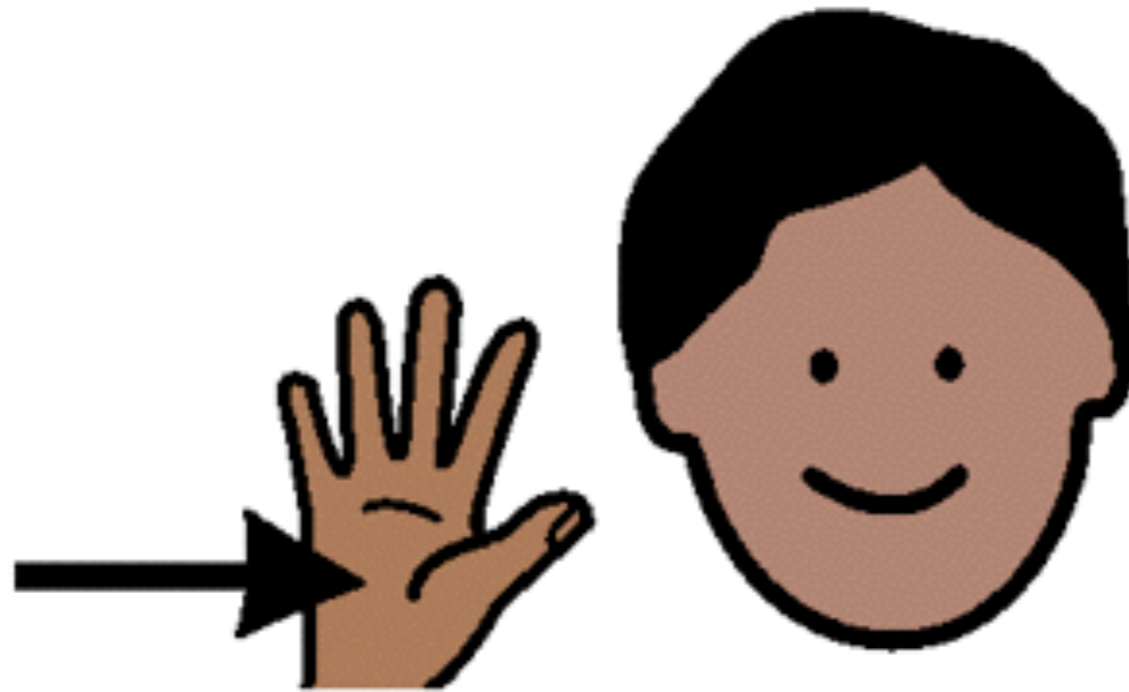

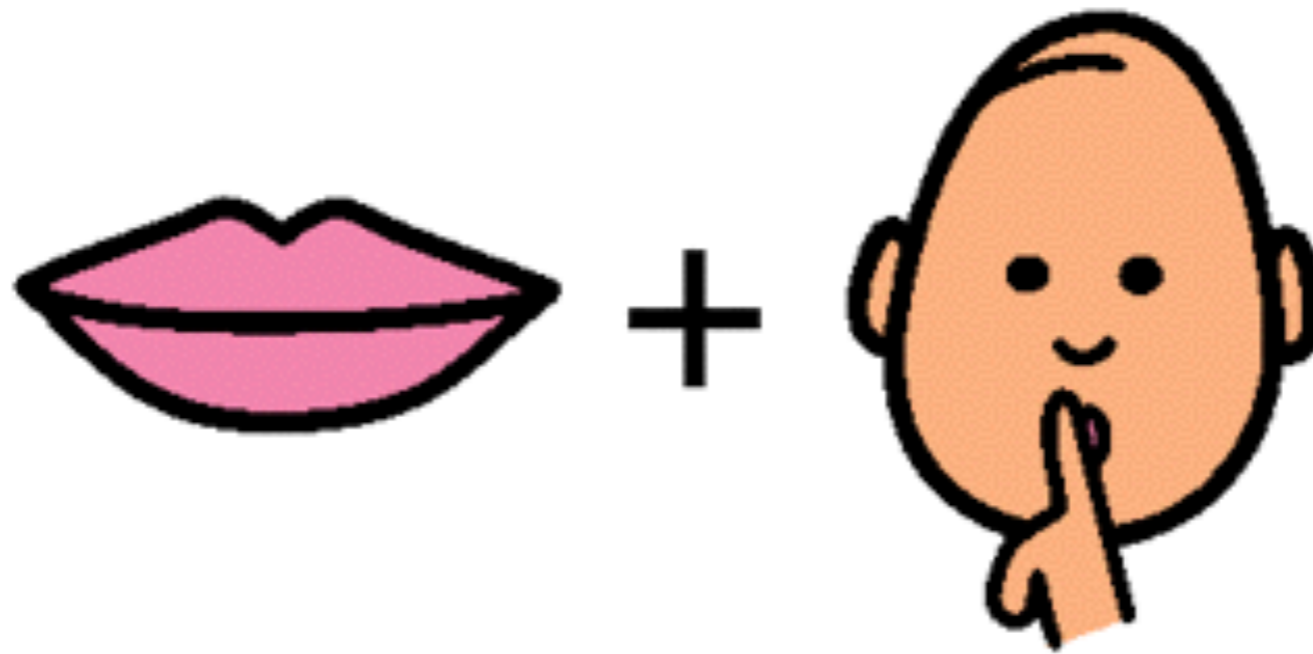
Give Me Five



When an adult says "Give Me Five"
it is a signal to get our attention.
"Give Me Five" is used everywhere
at Schrader Elementary



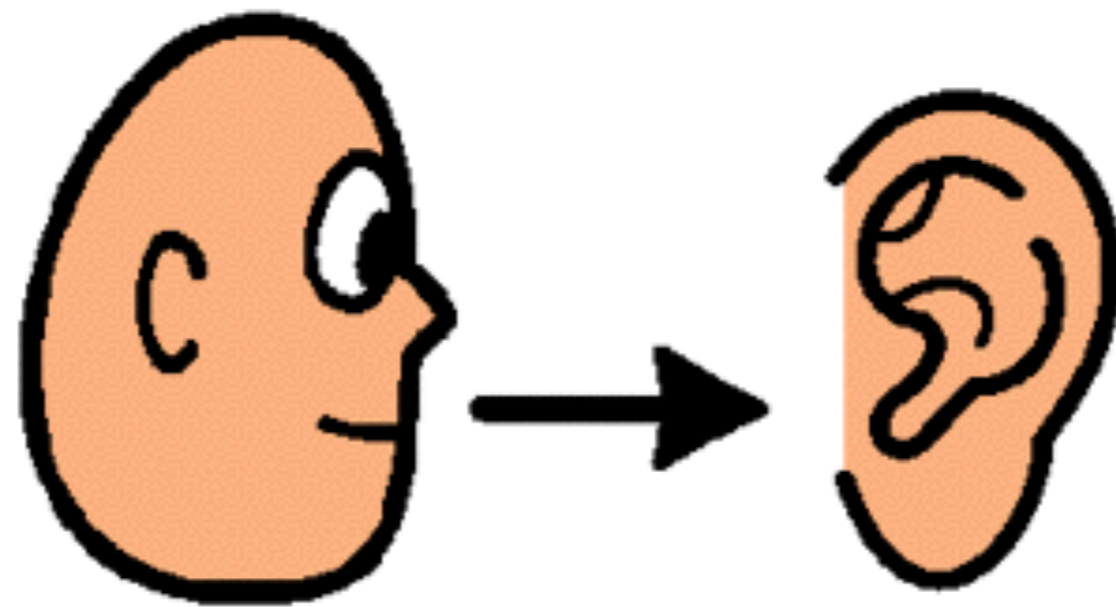
When we hear "Give Me Five," we put our hands up and face the speaker.



When we hear "Give Me Five," we have our mouths quiet. This means we are not talking with others. This shows the speaker that we are ready to listen.



When we hear "Give Me Five," we put our eyes on the speaker. This shows the speaker that we are ready to listen.



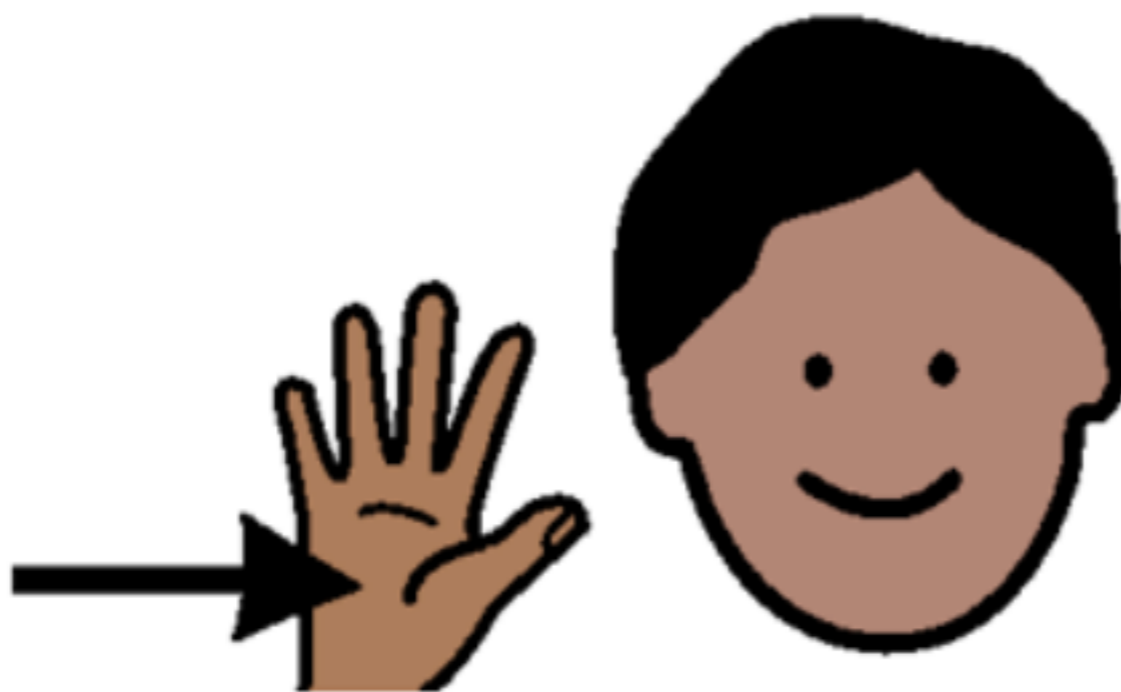
When we hear "Give Me Five," we listen with our ears. This shows the speaker that we are ready to listen.



When we hear "Give Me Five," we have our bodies and feet facing the speaker. This shows the speaker that we are ready to listen.



When we hear "Give Me Five," we have our hands still. This shows the speaker that we are ready to listen.
