

Principal's Message



Communication between home and school is critical to your child's success. Please do not hesitate to send in a note in your child's planner, email or contact the school to discuss any concerns or questions you may have about your child's progress. If you come to school to meet with your child's teacher, please set this up in advance, as they will not be able to meet you during instructional time as they are with their class.

We want to remind families the start of our instructional day is 9:40 AM. Being on time to school is critical to helping your child maximize his/her learning every day. If your child is late to school for any reason, it is critical that he/she is escorted into the office (by an adult) and signed in. Students should not be dropped off before 9:15 AM because there isn't adult supervision to watch students before that time. Students will not be dismissed for early dismissal after 3:15 PM except for emergency situations. We appreciate your help in maintaining fidelity to student safety and instructional time every day for every child at Schrader Elementary School.

Notes from the Clinic




